This parallion eli populations homes throut program, homes throut program thr	 YHP is the statewide Disease Management program. It launched in July 2006 and is now in its third year. We have approximately 11,000 eligible DM beneficiaries located in LTC facilities. A YHP overview document is included along with these minutes for your review. Sue noted that she recently attending a conference where some good information was provided on pressure ulcers and impact of nurse practitioner services. This information was from CMS and Sue will forward on for review. Illinois Health Connect is the Primary Care Case Mgmt (PCCM) program here in IL. This program links beneficiaries with a medical home. There are 1.8million eligible beneficiaries in IL (~1.2m are children). Managed Care populations are excluded. Currently there are approximately 5300 medical homes throughout the state. LTC populations are not included in the PCCM program, however, a provider can continue to see his or her patient if they transition into the LTC setting.

We are working to expand to other facilities including sites outside of the Chicago area. Program has ~1200 residents under management at any given time. We are working with facilities to evaluate resident progress and ensure we have the right 1200 under management at any given point in time. To date we have documented many wonderful success stories that help illustrate the impact of the program. Sue indicated that she would be interested in including an update within newsletter publications. YHP is available to assist with content or information that may be of assistance. Dr. Harvey noted that it is important to focus on primary prevention and screening tests. 		

Clinical Metric Profiling	 Project is currently in pilot phase. Profiles were sent in late August to 11 sites in the NuCare group. We are currently working with Michelle Stuercke to gather feedback. We are looking to expand to additional LTC facilities with our next mailing targeted for December 1st. 	
Pharmacy Reviews	 We are current assessing the possibilities on conducting pharmacy reviews in the LTC setting (similar to what is currently done in the community setting today). To date no reviews have been mailed to facilities. Sue noted that it will be important to direct that messaging to the LTC pharmacy so as to avoid conflicting messaging or confusion.
