Jonathan Jackson, Provider Services Manager with Illinois Health Connect (IHC PCCM), chaired this meeting, took names, and performed roll call.

Molly Siegel, Project Manager, HFS Bureau of Managed Care, provided the following updates:

CCE UPDATES

My Health, Precedence, and T4H, in Cook County, are currently operational. The remaining CCEs in Cook County will go live in January and February. Entire Care will go live in early January and Be Well will go live in early February, each with an expected enrollment of approximately 1000 to 2000 patients in year one. Each CCE has their own targeted population, for example, serving clients with Long Term Care needs and who are chronically homeless. Children with Complex Medical Needs (CCMN) CCEs may go in effect early spring. There are three awarded CCEs for Children with CCMN including Lurie, La Rabida, and OSF.

The state expects to start enrollment with ACEs for care coordination in Spring 2014. Dr Siddiqi, IHC Medical Director, provided links for more information on Care Coordination and reminded everyone that Molly did two presentations for the CCE's on November 6th and November 20th. The slides are available online at the IHC website to view or download. In response to a question regarding client eligibility in the CCE program, Molly explained that children will be enrolled if they meet CRG - Clinical Risk Group rating to include really high risk children in pediatric groups if they meet criteria.

Pam Bunch, from HFS, stated that patients will get a mailing for Open Enrollment if they are eligible to be enrolled. The question was asked, "When do PCP's have to join an ACE?" Molly stated applications

for ACEs are due January 3rd. ACE- PCP panels will still be no more than 1800. Dr. Goyal provided himself as a resource for further questions about ACEs and their structure. He stated there are 25 organizations listed on the HFS website who have submitted letters of intent to become an ACE. Dr. Siddiqi reminded everyone on the call that ACEs will be discussed at the next Provider network subcommittee meeting and more information would be available when the ACEs are awarded next spring.

Dr. Siddiqi provided the following info on ISMS' ER/LA Opioid Course:

On July 9, 2012, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved a risk evaluation and mitigation strategy (REMS) for extended-release (ER) and long-acting (LA) opioid medications. The Collaborative on REMS Education (CO*RE), a multidisciplinary collaboration of 10 partners and three cooperating organizations, has designed a core curriculum to meet the requirements of the FDA REMS Blueprint. The Illinois State Medical Society is providing this education at no cost to participants. The program can be accessed through <http://www.isms.org/opioids>. It is free for any prescriber to take (physicians, APNs, PAs, etc). Physicians can earn 2.0 AMA PRA Category 1 CME credits. ISMIE Mutual policyholders can take the course for a discount on their liability insurance premium and should access the course through the designated link on the page. All others should take the course through the "Other Physicians" link.

Dr. Ricardo Rivera, MATEC Illinois Site Manager, provided the following update on Midwest Aids Training + Education Center (MATEC):

The Mountain-Midwest HIV Telehealth Initiative (MMHTI) is recruiting new clinics for their distance-based collaborative network of providers that targets clinics serving low volumes of HIV patients. The initiative increases access to care and improves health outcomes for people living with HIV. MMHTI monthly meetings provide: timely updates on HIV infection and related conditions, real time interactive

consultations for actual patient problems and care concerns, access to experienced providers, information about resources along with educational programs and technical assistance, continuing education credits and online access to resources and materials.
