Asthma Education	 Margaret Kirkegaard asked a question related to the PCCM QI initiatives/profiles. Is there a standard for Asthma education similar to what exists for Diabetes education? How is it reimbursed on the private/commercial side? The group noted that there are three codes but there are not specific to asthma and are not used well. There are approximately 175 certified educators in IL, which is relatively high compared to other states. There is no incentive since there is no billing code. There has been some movement/effort nationally, but not enough to substantially change the current practice.
